MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT

I deem it a privilege to have the opportunity to address this communication to you. I thank you for the confidence reposed in me, in electing me as the President of our Society. I cannot but feel humble when I see the illustrious

of eminent personalities who have held this position in the past.

My formal induction into TSI took place in 1996 at the instance of my friend and former colleague Dr J. Bhatia. This happened after a decision was taken by the then Executive Committee under the leadership of Mr Sudhir Singhal, President of the Society, to hold the first international conference (ICIT 1997) at Kolkata to commemorate the silver-jubilee of the commencement of the Tribology movement in India. My employers, Balmer Lawrie & Co Ltd., had, in principle, agreed to conduct the conference on behalf of TSI. Since Dr Bhatia had taken another assignment within our group and was based at Mumbai, he suggested that the responsibility for organising the conference be entrusted to me. I was thus nominated as the Organising Secretary of ICIT 97. It was baptism by fire.

Reflecting the multi-disciplinary character of Tribology, our society is quite unique as a professional body in the sense that it brings together people of diverse technical disciplines from every type of organisation- a variety of industrial organisations, research institutes, academic institutions, services sector, etc. While we benefit from the diversity, which also enriches the development of the science as such, it also poses a challenge to evolve activities of wide interest and progress the charter of the Society. We, the office bearers and other members of the new Executive Committee, propose to draw up a mission for the next two years along with a comprehensive action plan. We would share this with you shortly and with the feedback, support and guidance of our predecessors, the regional chapters and all members, we shall endeavour to implement the same. MESSAGE FROM SECRETARY Let us Hear you – The Tribologist

Dear Tribologist,

This is the first issue of TSI Newsletter since the new Executive Committee of Tribology Society of India took over for year 2005-2007. In a way, it has been an event similar to earlier events from the history pages of TSI. At the end of



a biennial conference, a new EC is elected. Many old faces continue with induction of a few new ones. Yes! There are always winning combinations. Let us hope the new EC makes a winning team with you in the lead. There are challenges to be won over - Constitution is to be redrafted in tune with current needs; local chapters are to be revitalized; and overall rapid decline of Tribology education in even premier academic institutions like IITs need to be corrected. There are many more challenges in the minds of all those who call themselves students of Tribology. In 1972, just after six years of the Jost's report, IIT Delhi was host to a truly International conference on Tribology, and subsequently a center of Tribology (ITMMEC) came into existence. Many such activities started in 70s and in later years in the country with much fanfare. But did we reach anywhere near excellence in Tribology education and research? Or we all have learnt the art of politicizing even the science and finally end up like increasing poverty despite the best practices on paper. Then some where down the line, the scientists get together, make NGOs, Societies to support the government initiatives or to further the cause wherever governments fail, but then end up in the glory of their own portfolios. Like poverty gets lip service, Tribology too is in the same category. Failures of elected democracy to honour their deliverables has been quoted often to have roots in the indifferent attitudes of the elected and the electorates.

Can we in TSI escape the inevitable – the indifference of attitudes? Please write to me what you think TSI should do to further the education of Tribology in the country. I assure you that at the EC we are listening carefully to what members suggest and from this will emerge the TSI charter of activities for the year 2005-2007.

4th International Conference on Industrial Tribology 15th to 18th December 2004 - A Round Up

The Fourth International Conference on Industrial Tribology was off to flying start on 15th December 2004 at Hotel Hyatt Regency, Mumbai. As you all know the conference is held biennially under the aegis of Tribology Society of India. It is for the first time that the conference was organized by a consortium of four leading industrial faces of India, viz.; Indian Oil Corporation Limited, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited, Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited and Larsen and Toubro Limited. The conference was spread over four days from 15th December 2004 to 18th December 2004.

The conference was inaugurated by Mr. M S Ramachandran, formar Chairman, Indian Oil Corporation Ltd., in a glittering ceremony held in the Regency Ball Room of Hotel Hyatt Regency Mumbai. A number of dignitaries from major industrial organizations as well as Heads of Academic and Research Institutions along with a large number of delegates,

who have come from far and near places in India, and a significant number from abroad, were in attendance during the inaugural function. Mr. Ramachandran briefly touched upon the progress of Tribology globally, and in particular in the Indian scenario. He recalled the contribution made by Mr. Indu Vira, the Founder President of Tribology Society of India, who happened to be a member of IndianOil fraternity. He underlined the need for adoption of good tribological practices and reaping its benefits as envisaged in the Jost report of 1966.

need for a condition based maintenance programme for Equipment Reliability He re-emphasized the need for a systematic programme maintenance of plant equipment to get maximum output from and their availability for increased production. Tribology has an important role to play in this. The effective maintenance programme will not only increase equipment life but also reduce the cost of production which is so vital in the present times severe global competitive market.

Mr. Mukesh Rohtagi, Director (Refineries), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd, presented a very informative and thought provoking theme lecture on the theme of "Tribology in Equipment Reliability" which was widely appreciated.

Proceedings of the conference both in CD and hard copy form and Souvenir were released for the delegates by the Chief Guest.

Mementos were given to the dignitaries present on the dais by Mr. C Mishra and Mr. VN Sharma, President and Secretary of the Tribology Society of India respectively.

Planery sessions were organised on all three days of the conference

On the first day three key note papers were presented. Dr AG Plint of Phoenix Tribology UK spoke on Recent Advances in Tribo-Testing. Dr Braham Prakash of University of Lulea, Sweden, made a presentation on "Tribology in Sweden". Mr. MG Poduval of VEC, SKF India spoke on the subject of Vibration Analysis Based Condition Monitoring.

On the second day Prof. SK Biswas of Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore spoke on the mechanism of Boundary Lubrication Additives. In his own inimitable manner, Prof Biswas touched upon the progress made so far to understand the complex mechanism of boundary lubrication additives. He specially touched upon the subject of lubrication of aluminum-based engines. Mr SK Wagh of Lubrizol India gave a detailed overview of global research in the area of new generation cost effective lubricating oil additives.

On the third day Dr Har Prashad made a presentation on the new design of high speed rolling element bearings for energy conservation and stability. Dr B Venkataraman of DMRL, Hyderabad gave a talk on new materials for tribological applications.

Technical Papers

A total of eighty papers were presented in the conference during three days of the proceedings. Of these sixty papers were presented in the twelve parallel oral sessions, whereas another twenty were presented in the poster session. Out of the papers presented in the conference, three papers were selected by a technical jury of three eminent tribologists for Best Paper Award in three categories viz.: Basic Research, Applied Research and in Poster Session. Following is a brief of the award winning papers.

Dr H Hirani of Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay presented a paper entitled "Optimizing Groove Arrangement Using Genetic Algorithm". The paper provides a study on the groove geometry (circumferential and axial extent), the location of feeding groove and oil-feed pressure in the cylindrical journal bearing for optimum bearing performance (maximum load capacity, minimum side leakage, and minimum friction loss). Mass

conserving algorithm is adopted to predict accurate bearing performance. Constraints on minimum film thickness, maximum pressure, and temperature rise are exercised. Multiobjective genetic algorithm, an optimization search method, is described in detail to locate the optimum configuration.

Dr Barun Chakrabarti of L&T Mumbai presented a paper entitled "Role of Bearings in Rotating M a c h i n e r y Diagnostics ". This paper presents two practical examples where major problems in critical machines were traced

to bearing-related causes. The first case study deals with a failure in the generator of a gas turbine-generator unit during commissioning of a power plant. The second case study discusses the vibration problems in a vertical cooling water pump of a power station. In both these examples, the diagnosis could be done using fundamental principles of bearing design

and operation. As a result. both the machines were successfully put back into service, thus avoiding serious implications downtime and costs. The paper concludes that bearings often hold the key to successful troubleshooting. Using a systematic approach

based on fundamental tribological principles, one can solve apparently serious machinery problems.

Mr. VK Sukhwani presented a paper in the poster session titled "Experimental evaluation of Torque Characteristics of MR Brake".
